





- **Stakeholders**: Public administrations, industry, and research communities involved in digital transformation.


Horizon Europe



- Funding Source: Horizon Europe is the EU's main funding

 for 2021-2027. Overall it is expected that 35% will support
 digital transformation.
- **Stakeholders**: Researchers, universities, research organizations, SMEs, public authorities, and private sector entities.
- **Objectives**: HE has a dedicated budget for enabling technologies, such as artificial intelligence and robotics, next generation Internet, high performance computing, big data, key digital technologies, 6G.

- Objectives: CEF aims to enhance EU connectivity and infrastructure by funding projects that develop and modernize digital networks. It supports public administrations in deploying high-speed broadband, digital public services, and secure digital infrastructures to improve administrative efficiency and citizen engagement



- **Funding Source**: Interreg is financed through the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) and other EU instruments.
- **Stakeholders**: Regional and local authorities, public bodies, NGOs, and businesses.
- **Objectives**: Interreg promotes cross-border, transnational, and interregional cooperation. It funds projects that enhance digital connectivity and innovation in public administrations, facilitating collaboration and knowledge sharing across regions to address common challenges and improve public service delivery.

Technical Support Instrument (TSI)



- **Funding Source**: TSI is funded through the EU budget under DG REFORM, with a focus on supporting structural reforms.
- **Stakeholders**: National and regional authorities of EU Member States, experts from Member States' administrations, international organisations, private firms, and consultants.
- **Objectives**: TSI provides tailored technical expertise to help Member States design and implement digital reforms. It supports projects that enhance digital governance, modernise public administration, and improve public service delivery through the adoption of digital technologies.



InvestEU



- Funding Source: InvestEU supports sustainable investments by leveraging both private and public funds. It aims to mobilize over €372 billion in investments through an EU budgetary guarantee.
- **Stakeholders**: National, regional and local governments. Public agencies. Companies and non-profit organisations.
- Objectives: InvestEU recognizes the importance of digitalization for Europe's competitiveness and prosperity. At least 10% of the program's resources will be directed toward digital objectives. This aligns with the European Green Deal and emphasizes the transition to a digital economy.



Main requirements (specific requirements in the call document)

- Most calls require proposals from consortia, consisting of partners from different eligible countries
- Most consortia need to gather a minimum number of partners.
- Some call topics specify types of organisations that have to be part of a consortium


- Legal entities (public or private bodies and international organisations of European interest)
- that are established in a EU member state or an eligible non-EU country
- There may be restrictions regarding security and strategic autonomy (calls regarding cybersecurity, Al and HPC)




Participation of third countries
















Application Form



- Part A Administrative information generated by the IT system in the Portal submission system
- Part B Narrative description of the project. Part B needs to be uploaded as PDF (+ annexes) in the Submission System. The templates to use are available in the submission site.

How to prepare and submit it?



- The Application Form must be prepared by the consortium and submitted by a representative.
- Page limit normally 70 pages (unless indicated in the Call)
- supporting documents can be provided as an annex and do not count towards the page limit
- Keep your text as concise as possible. Do not use hyperlinks to show information that is an essential part of your application

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Your proposed work must be within the scope of a work programme topic



You need to demonstrate that your idea is ambitious and goes beyond the state of the art

EXCELLENCE



Your scientific methodology must take into account interdisciplinary, gender dimension and open science practices. It must not significantly harm the environment



You should show how your project could contribute to the outcomes and impacts described in the work programme (the pathway to impact)

IMPACT



You should describe the planned measures to maximise the impact of your project ('plan for the dissemination and exploitation including communication activities')



You should demonstrate the quality of your work plan, resources and participants

IMPLEMENTATION



Evaluation



Award criteria

- Relevance (e.g. alignment with objectives, contribution to longterm policy objectives and relevant policies, synergies with other activities)
- Implementation (e.g. maturity of the project, soundness of implementation plan, efficient use of resources, capacity of applicants)
- Impact (e.g. expected outcomes and deliverables, strengthen competitiveness, benefits for society)
